Weekly Caretakers Report

Week of March 5th, 2023

Another week of recovery has passed at Hideaway Bay. ADU continues doing mold remediation. FEMA continues barging debris from the North end of the island but still has not come through Hideaway Bay.

My week was spent doing maintenance and landscaping work. The grass was cut on the East side of the property and weed wacking / trimming was done as well. I am planning on doing the West side of the property next week. Two engine stands needed to be built to hold the Yamaha F150 motors on the ferry so lumber and hardware was purchased and hauled to the island and the two motor stands were constructed and placed on the ferry so the repair yard will have them on hand when needed. On Thursday the Captains and I constructed a pusher and attached it to the skiff so the skiff could safely push the ferry to the marina. The engine stands and new Yamaha motors were loaded on the ferry. On Friday we were able to get the ferry to Gasparilla Marina where it was hauled out of the water and the bottom was cleaned. On Monday it will be transported from the marina to the boat yard for repairs. I also had a chance to paint some of the wooden signs on the mainland, replace some outlets on the owner's dock, replace the chlorine dosing barrel due to a leak as well as general cleanup of landscaping and debris. Next week Pye Barker Fire and Safety will be doing our annual inspection for the fire systems to start my week.

NES was on the island to work on the sewage plant, and they report things are up and running and going well. Clay our IT tech was on the island working on replacing the owners dock camera as well as the parking lot cameras.

The Captains had a busy week getting the ferry ready for transport, doing cleanup as well as their usual duties keeping the rest rooms cleaned and sanitized, keeping the docks cleaned and general maintenance.

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
