Weekly Caretaker Report

Week of April 2<sup>nd</sup> 2023

Another week of reconstruction has passed at Hideaway Bay. ADU continues to do mold remediation. FEMA has made their 2<sup>nd</sup> pass through Hideaway Bay and has removed all the bulk debris, but some vegetation piles remain. A lot of work remains to pick up the small items of trash that remain throughout the property. Small amounts of red tide remain in the air, but it hasn't gotten any worse.

My week started out replacing boards and tightening screws on the mainland dock. Work was done in the mainland parking lot to remove trash from the area around our fuel storage and remove the damaged wood fencing. I have plans to replace the wood fence next week, materials have been ordered and delivered. On the island the landscaping remains a priority while we have FEMA to remove all the cuttings, so work continues to trim bushes and trees. The grass was cut on the East side of the property as well.

Clay has been on the island this week to restore the WIFI to all the buildings. He reports everything is going well so far as he works his way through all the buildings.

The captains have been busy with their usual tasks and helping with the landscaping and maintenance projects.
